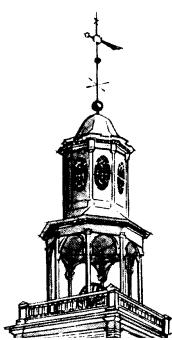

Christmas at Old First

The *first Sunday in Advent* on December 3 is a special day at Old First with our annual *Hanging of the Greens!* We begin at 9:30 a.m. with a scrumptious breakfast served in the narthex, followed by "decking the halls". The *second Sunday in Advent:* The poinsettias arrive on December 10 completing the Christmas décor. We will have our usual 11:00 a.m. worship service.

December 17th, the *third Sunday in Advent:* Following the morning worship the deacons will set up the globes and candles in preparation for the evening Candlelight Service and the lay readers will have an opportunity to practice their readings from the upper pulpit. *The Candlelight Service of Lessons and Carols begins at 7:00 p.m.* Playing the organ that night will be Jacqueline Metsma. Continuing with our tradition, the Bennington Children's Chorus will be singing. Bring a friend along and be a part of this annual event at Old First! This service is a gift we make to the wider community and it's a real treat to have so many visitors. A wheelchair ramp will be available.

December 24, the *fourth Sunday in Advent:* There will be **NO MORNING WORSHIP.** Join us for our much anticipated *Christmas Eve service* which takes place at 5:00 p.m. This family service will be filled with a meaningful Christmas message, familiar carols and readings. Jacqueline Metsma will be playing the organ and Virginia Poole will be playing the oboe. The service concludes with the congregation singing "Silent Night" with lighted candles in front of the church. A wheelchair ramp will be available.

A Year-End Reminder Regarding Pledge payments...

In an effort to follow the tax laws as closely as we can, please understand that we *must* have your 2017 contributions **IN THE OFFICE** by December 31. Any donations that are received after December 31, *regardless of the date that you've written on the check*, must be counted as contributions made in 2018. While it might be tempting to put a pre-dated check into the collection plate on that day and ask that it be counted in 2017, we really cannot make those exceptions. However, if sent through the mail, any envelope with a postmark of December 31, 2017, or earlier, despite its date of delivery to the office, can count as "received by" the end of the year.
