*HYMN Awake, My Soul, and with the Sun

Thomas Ken (1637-1711) was born at Little Berkhampstead, Hertfordshire, England, but went to live with his brother-in-law, Isaak Walton, after his parents died when Ken was nine years old. He was educated at Winchester and New College, Oxford. He was curate for Little Easton in Essex for three years after his ordination in 1662 and served for one year as a domestic chaplain to Bishop Morley. King James II of England declared the author of this hymn, Thomas Ken, the most eloquent preacher among Protestants of his time.

Old 124th is from the Genevan Psalter (1551), where it is the setting for Psalm 124. Though many arrangements of the tune are available, the present one is from *The Hymnal* (1933), which is a slight modification of the arrangement in *The English Hymnal* (1906). It is said that when the Duke of Savoy was defeated in his attack against Geneva, December 12, 1602, the grateful people sang Psalm 124 to this tune.

The Latin text of this hymn is from a prayer attributed to Alcuin (c. 735-804). Born in Northumbria, he was educated at the Cathedral school in York, where he spent most of his life. He became master of the school in 766 and at the time of his death was abbot of the monastery of St. Martin at Tours. Alcuin was a counselor and cultural adviser to Charlemagne and inspired the Carolingian Renaissance. He revised the Roman lectionary in Gaul and composed votive masses. He is also credited with the introduction of the Feast of All Saints.



Awake, My Soul, and with the Sun

Awake, my soul, and with the sun your daily stage of duty run; Shake off dull sloth, and joyful rise To pay your morning sacrifice.

Lord, I my vows to You renew. Disperse my sins as morning dew; Guard my first springs of thought and will, And with Yourself my spirit fill.

Direct, control, suggest, this day, All I design or do or say; That all my powers, with all their might, in Your sole glory may unite.

FIRST LESSON Romans 12:1-8

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

Now Israel may say, and that in truth: if that the Lord had not our right maintained, if that the Lord had not with us remained when cruel foes against us rose to strive, we surely had been swallowed up alive.

Yea, when their wrath against us fiercely rose, the swelling tide had o'er us spread its wave, the raging stream had then become our grave, the surging flood, in proudly swelling roll, most surely then had overwhelmed our soul.

Blest be the Lord, who made us not their prey; as from the snare a bird escapeth free, their net is rent and so escaped are we; our only help is in God's holy name, who made the earth and all the heavenly frame.

SECOND LESSON Matthew 16:13-20

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.
